To provide a team learning environment that promotes interdisciplinary dentistry in an exchange of knowledge to advance the level of diagnosis and treatment provided to our patients.

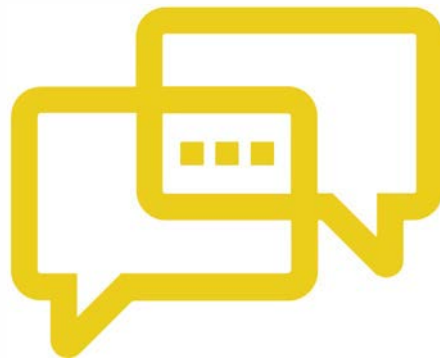
# Common Language 2018 - 2019

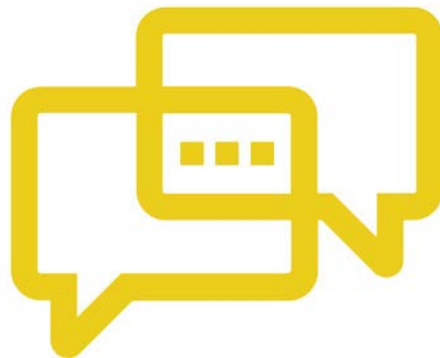

This course provides a systematic approach to restore the extensive mouth rehabilitation:

1. Where we are and where are we going with ceramic materials
2. New bonding protocols. Is etching the only way?
3. What material to use for the implant abutment
4. Cement selection: bonding vs retention
5. New generation of monolithic ceramic materials
6. New bonding protocols for the new generation of ceramic materials
7. The new generation of ceramics for veneer restorations
8. Techniques to avoid excess cement on implant supported crowns
9. Finally, the course will address the indications and considerations for orthodontic extrusion and other complex orthodontic movements in the esthetic zone in preparation for implant

**Dr. Marco Brindis** is a professor at the Prosthodontics Department at Louisiana State University, where he also maintains an intramural restorative practice devoted to esthetics and implants with an interdisciplinary approach. He earned a D.D.S from the Universidad Intercontinental in Mexico City in 1998. He did a Preceptorship in Dental Implants at the Universidad Intercontinental in 1999 and a Preceptorship in Dental Implants at the Dental School at the UT Health Science Center in San Antonio in 2002. He completed a surgical Implant Fellowship at the Biotechnology Institute in Vitoria Spain in 2003. He got his Certificate in Prosthodontics at LSU School of Dentistry in the Department of Prosthodontics in 2007. He then completed the Esthetic and Occlusion courses at the Pankey Institute in 2007. Dr. Brindis is very passionate in the field of interdisciplinary dentistry for full mouth reconstruction, esthetics and implant dentistry. He is involved in the development of new implant protocols to treat the edentulous patient. He has lectured nationally and internationally. He is a member of several organizations including the American Academy of Restorative Dentistry, Academy of Osseointegration, American Dental Association, American College of Prosthodontist and the Pierre Fauchard Academy.

**Smile Bangladesh** is a New Jersey based nonprofit medical organization dedicated to caring for children and adults afflicted with facial cleft deformities in Bangladesh and around the world. It is estimated that there are up to 300,000 children and adults in Bangladesh with unrepaired cleft deformities. Conversely, it is estimated that there are less than 30 surgeons in the country with formal training in cleft surgery. This translates to about 10,000 cleft patients per surgeon.

The greatest hurdle in caring for cleft patients in Bangladesh is access to care. Most Bengali's with cleft deformities are from the more rural areas of the nation. Many don't even know that clefts can be repaired; those who do are often unable to access or afford care.

Each November, John Wallace and several other volunteer surgeons, anesthesiologists, and nurses travel to rural and urban areas of Bangladesh to repair facial clefts, providing free care to these individuals. Join us for this annual charity dinner to support this special cause.

Dentists and even some endodontists don't always see a connection between the terms "treatment planning" and "endodontics". Many of them view root canal treatment as a mindless mechanical procedure. Dr. Schwartz will share his views of endodontics as a thoughtful, carefully planned process that is completely integrated into the overall treatment plan.

Dr. Schwartz will conduct an interactive, case-based presentation on decision-making and treatment planning for a wide variety of clinical situations. The overall emphasis will be on the role of endodontics in multi-specialty care and how well planned and well-executed endodontic treatment can improve the outcomes in restorative dentistry, periodontal therapy and implants. The long-term implications of treatment will be discussed. He will present case histories and lead the audience through the thought process of diagnosis, case selection, endodontic considerations, restorative considerations and execution of the treatment. He will show how he treated the patients, discuss his rationale and emphasize the importance of the "patient conversation". He will also discuss the use of "decision points" in treatment planning, risk/benefit/cost analysis, and "special situations". Many long-term recalls will be presented.

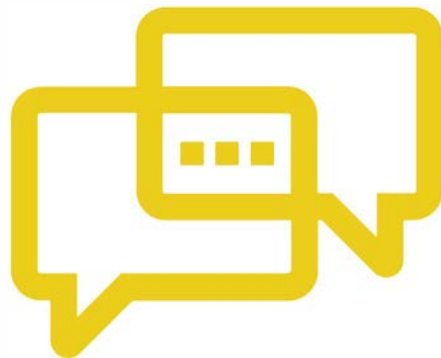
**Dr. Rick Schwartz** was a restorative dentist for 19 years prior to entering post-graduate training in endodontics. He attended a 2-year general dentistry residency, and then did a combination of private practice, teaching and dental materials research before entering endodontic training in 1996. He has authored over 100 articles and abstracts and was a cover author on 3 editions of "Fundamentals of Operative Dentistry" by Quintessence Publishing Co. He is first author of the book "Best Practices in Endodontics", also from Quintessence, and is a cover author of "Advanced CBCT for Endodontics." For the past 20 years he has been in full time private practice limited to endodontics in San Antonio, TX. He has lectured extensively in U.S. and in 14 other countries.

This is a hands-on, lecture course. In every dental practice, there are numerous patients with severely worn dentitions. Many of these patients would love to have a full mouth rehabilitation yet cannot afford to do so all at once. These patients can effectively be treated utilizing a treatment plan phased in over many months or even years.

Treatment planning is the key to success with such cases. There are many common clinical challenges that often lead to case failure one of which is over-focus on esthetics while compromising biomechanical principles. Other common challenges with these cases include bonding to different substrates, occlusal disharmony issues and the development of an ideal occlusal plane throughout the treatment plan. The Kois deprogrammer will be discussed to help understand centric relation position and help determine vertical dimension of occlusion.

***Dentists should bring magnification (loupes) and/ or protective lenses.*** All models, materials, and equipment will be provided.

**Dr. Robert Margeas** graduated from the University of Iowa College of Dentistry in 1986 and completed his AEGD residency the following year. He is currently an adjunct professor in the department of Operative Dentistry at the University of Iowa. He is Board Certified by the American Board of Operative Dentistry. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Aesthetic Dentistry, a Fellow of the Academy of General Dentistry, American Society for Dental Aesthetics and International Team of Oral implantologists (ITI). He has written numerous articles on esthetic and implant dentistry, and lectures and presents hands-on courses nationally and internationally on those subjects. He is currently the Editor in Chief of Inside Dentistry, on the Editorial Board of Compendium, and is a contributing editor to Oral Health in Canada. His memberships include OKU Honor Dental Society, American Academy of Esthetic Dentistry, and the American Academy of Restorative Dentistry. Dr. Margeas maintains a full-time private practice focusing on comprehensive restorative and implant dentistry in Des Moines.

Dr. KoIs is the recipient of the 2002 Saul Schluger Memorial Award for Clinical Excellence in Diagnosis and Treatment Planning, and received a Lifetime Achievement Award from both the World Congress of Minimally Invasive Dentistry and the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry. Additionally, he is the recipient of the 2014 Dr. Thaddeus V. Weclaw Award, which is presented annually to a dedicated educator who embodies the spirit of comprehensive dental care. He is the past President of both the American Academy of Restorative Dentistry and American Academy of Esthetic Dentistry, and a member of numerous other professional organizations. In addition, he continues to work with restorative dentists at the KoIs Center, a didactic and clinical teaching program.
